Scenic Spot Selected for the Michelin Green Guide

Oirase Mountain Stream

Access Okuse, Towada City, Aomori (JR bus bound for "Towadako Yasumiya" from Shin-Aomori Station, Aomori Station or Hachinohe Station)

Keiryu (mountain stream) two stars. Cliffs covered by deep natural forest line both banks of the stream, and the entire 14km path has superb scenery. We highly recommend taking the trek through the pure forest air, taking in its natural beauty, and experiencing changes in the stream throughout the seasons and time of day. The best season for viewing fresh green leaves is from May to early June. The beauty of mid to late October autumn leaves is also popular.



Blue Lake Towada Reflects the Sky and Mountains Like a Mirror

Lake Towada

Beautiful Lake Towada is a volcanic caldera that reflects the sky and mountains like a mirror. At roughly 46km in circumference and 327m at its deepest point, it is the third deepest lake in Japan. A beech forest and other trees grow around the lake, where the beauty of the four seasons can be enjoyed by seeing vibrant green during spring and summer, deep-colored leaves during autumn, and a silver woodland scene during winter. Despite being a northern lake at a high elevation, this lake doesn't freeze over during the winter, and due to this, it is referred to as "the Mysterious Lake".

Access Towada City, Aomori (1 hour and 30 minutes by car from JR Shin-Aomori Station)

Superb View of 2,600 Cherry Trees (Sakura) and a White-walled Castle

Hirosaki Castle

Hirosaki Castle in Hirosaki Park, built in the Edo period, has the northernmost castle tower*1 in Japan and is designated as an important national cultural property. Its extensive castle walls in their original form being opened as a park is rare in Japan. There are about 2.600 Sakura in the park, and many people come for the blossoms in the spring. Seeing the Sakura in full bloom and Hirosaki Castle is like a time slip back to the Edo period. The very popular Hirosaki Cherry Blossom Festival held in late April or early May has about two million visitors from Japan and overseas. <*1 The tallest structure in the castle. >



Around 50 varieties of Sakura

Warriors from Tsugaru brought 25 Kasumi zakura from Kyoto in 1715, and presently 2,600 trees of 50 varieties including Somei voshino. Shidare zakura and Yae zakura are growing in Hirosaki Park. The outer moat when covered in Sakura petals is called a "Sakura carpet" and is a marvelous sight.

Walking Route to Experience Nature in Grand Shirakami-Sanchi

Shirakami-Sanchi and Jyuniko

Shirakami-Sanchi, a World Heritage Site, is in a mountain range which borders on Aomori and Akita prefectures. The pristine natural beech forest, largely unaffected by humans and one of the largest in the world, has many trekking routes for a unique nature experience. An especially popular trek is the 12 pond walk route with the cobalt blue Aoike (blue pond) and the emerald green Wakitsubo pond. There is little up and down so it's easy for beginning trekkers too. Enjoy nature's beautiful colors, fresh green, crimson leaves and bright colored birds.

About 5500 Year Old Jomon Village Site

Special Historical Site Sannai-Maruyama Site

This is the biggest Jomon village site in Japan and is designated as a special historical site. Excavation and research undertaken since 1992 has uncovered the remains of pit houses, burial pits of adults and children, storage pits, and close to 2000 other relics. Some of the highlights include the reconstructed large pit-dwellings and large pillar-supported buildings. At the Jomon Jiyukan you can learn about the lives of the Jomon people through exhibits and array of activities such as making 'Magatama' beads and 'Dogu' miniature clay dolls.



Access 305, Maruyama, Oazasannai, Aomori City, Aomori (About 20 minutes by car from JR Aomori Station, and 10 minutes by car from JR Shin-Aomori Station)

Festivals

Popular Local Dish is a Unique **Food Sensation**

Hachinohe Sembei (Crispy Thin Cracker) Soup

A local dish of Hachinohe is sembei made with flour and salt put in a soup stock of meat, fish, mushrooms and vegetables, then cooked. This sembei developed for soups, is chewy when cooked, and has a pleasant texture similar to al dente pasta. Many foods also go well with the rich tasty soy sauce flavored soup. Hachinohe City has about 140 restaurants that offer the dish so it's fun to try and compare their dishes.





Aomori's apple history started from three seedlings planted in the Aomori Prefectural Government grounds in 1875, and now, Aomori grows about 60% of Japan's apples. The percentage for each variety is Fuji 50%, Orin, Jonagold, and Tsugaru each have 10% and other varieties make up the rest. Some of the processed goods made with the apples are juice, apple cider, jam, dressing and vinegar and they all make excellent gifts.

Hasshoku Center

At the 60 shops in this market. find the full lineup of Hachinohe's fresh seafood, dried foods and souvenirs. There are seasonal foods too, and the foods you buy can be charcoal broiled and eaten in the plaza on site or at places like Shichirinmura. There's also a playroom for kids too, so feel free to bring them

Aomori Nebuta Festival

Every year three million spectators gather for the Aomori Nebuta Festival. Large dolls (nebuta) made of wood, wire and Japanese paper with lights inside march through town. Dancers called haneto. dance wildly to calls of "rassera, rassera" for a very energizing performance. Anybody can participate if they wear the haneto outfit so don't just watch, be a part of the festivities yourself!

Nebuta Museum WA RASSE

Osorezan (Mt. Osore)

Gokuraku Beach with its mysterious bleak bare rock and white sand enveloped in the odor of sulfur, and the clear emerald green of the sea, along with Sainokawara entice you to visit a fantasy world with scenery that seems to be from both heaven and hell. There's also an onsen (hot spring) on the temple grounds and shrine visitors can bathe there to relive their tiredness

A Place that Connects Our World to the Other World

Osorezan (Mt. Osore) Sanmon (temple gate)

Osorezan on the Shimokita Peninsula, and Hieizan and Koyasan are the three most famous holy mountains in Japan, and visitors come to visit Osorezan from all over Japan. In the summer there's the Osorezan grand festival. and in autumn during the Osorezan Akimairi (fall temple visit) season, many people visit in remembrance of the spirits of the dead. At Osorezan you can sense the sacredness of a place that inherits and protects the culture of the northernmost region of Japan's mainland.

The Golden Heart of Hiraizumi

Chuson-ji Temple

Chuson-ji Temple was accepted in the World Heritage Registry in 2011, and is the home of the Konjikido (Golden Hall). First built in 1124 by Hiraizumi's ruler, Kiyohira Fujiwara, this shrine embodies the height of Heian craftsmanship. Coated inside and out with gold leaf, and further embellished with detailed engravings, inlays, and ornaments, the Konjikido speaks clearly to Hiraizumi's historical wealth and prosperity. The addition of the Buddha icons evokes the Buddhist afterlife, a paradise said to be watched over by the Buddha and lit by a



golden radiance. Making your way through the hilltop temple complex, surrounded by ancient trees, you may just feel as if you're in a moment out of time. The natural surroundings offer diverse views in every season, including cherry blossoms in spring, fresh greenery and flowers in summer, blazing autumn foliage, and a white blanket of snow in winter.

The Fuiiwara

Clan's Eternal Repose

The Konjikido is not just a shrine, but also a mausoleum for the Fuiiwara clan, Hiraizumi's 12th century founders and rulers. Though not visible to the public, the mummified remains of Kivohira, Motohira, Hidehira, and Yasuhira, the four generations of Fujiwara leaders, lie interred in golden caskets beneath the altar.

(About 2 hours and 15 minutes by car from JR Morioka Station)



An Onsen Resort to **Enjoy Diverse Hot Springs**

Hanamaki Onsen and Hanamakiminami Onsen Village

There are twelve unique onsen areas and among them are Dai Onsen, which is good for spending a quiet time in a mountain valley to refresh your body and Osawa Onsen where you can enjoy beautiful mountain stream scenery and a rotenburo (outdoor bath). In Hanamakiminami Onsen Gorge in the west of Hanamaki, there's an unusual onsen that has a bath that's 1.25m deep that you can stand in.

Access Panamaki City, Iwate (15 to 35 minutes by taxi or bus from JR Hanamaki Station)



Drive Through Bright Red Autumn Leaves

Sennintoge (Autumn Leaves)

Sennintoge is an 887m high pass on the boundary of Tono City and Kamaishi City. In 2007, the 18.6km Shinsennin Highway with four tunnels and nine bridges opened, making access better. The crimson leaves in autumn are especially beautiful and the best time to see them is from late October to early November. While popular for mountain climber, it is also well-known as a driving course. Tyr taking a breath along the road at the Kamaishi Sennintoge roadside station and enjoy the taste of local cuisine.

Underground Lake Shines a Mysterious Blue

Rvusendo Cave

As one of the 'Three Great Limestone Caves', Ryusendo Cave is a popular spot where you can see many limestone rocks while advancing through mysterious spaces. The highlight of the cave is the illuminated and very transparent underground pool. It glistens with a beautiful color called dragon blue. Enjoy passing through a spot called Moon Palace, a formation of overlapping rocks which has a heart-shape. Artwork of the two dragons' heads form shapes of heart, and is great date spot for couples. The cave temperature is always a cool 10 degrees Celsius, so be sure to bring something warm to wear even in summer.

Heavenly Beautiful Seashore

Jodogahama Beach

Jodogahama is a place you shouldn't miss on the Sanriku Coast. This coast formed about 5.2 million years ago, and is an awe-inspiring scene with white volcanic rock, small stones and inlets lined with pines that brings to mind a Japanese garden. You can also view Jodogahama in a pleasure boat and enjoy feeding the seagulls.


Three Major Noodles of Morioka You Should Eat

Morioka Reimen (Cold Noodles), Wanko Soba and Morioka Jaiamen

If you come to Morioka, be sure to eat Morioka Reimen, Wanko Soba and Morioka Jajamen. Morioka Reimen are noodles with robust body in cold soup, topped by meat, vegetables.

Kimchi and fruits pieces. Its looking is splendid too. The distinctive feature of Wanko Soba is a waitress seves you small amount of noodles one after another until you are full and can't eat. Morioka Jajamen is boiled flat udon with special meat miso sauce and shredded cucumbers eaten with ginger, vinegar and chili oil. It also can be finished off by adding a egg soup and enjoyed as "Chitan Soup".







Seafood Stuffed in a Bottle Pour It on Rice and Eat!

Bindon (Bottled Rice Bowl)

Bindon is a specialty of Miyako: sea urchin roe. salmon roe, and other seasonal food of Miyako are stuffed in a milk bottle. It's also beautiful to look at: it looks like a bottle filled with jewels. Arrange the content of the bottle on a bowl of hot rice, and eat. What makes this dish special is that it uses the five senses while seeing, arranging to eating. Be sure to eat this if you come to Miyako.

Pork with a Tender and Sophisticated Taste

Hakkin Pork

Hakkin Pork is a pork brand raised in Hanamaki City, Iwate Prefecture. The taste of this incredibly tender meat becomes even more delicious the more you chew, and if you try Hakkin Pork, you won't want to eat other pork because of its tenderness and high-quality fattiness which melts in your mouth without an off taste. We recommend it for people who like pork as steak or cutlets.





The World's Biggest Drum Parade

Morioka Sansa Odori Festival

Held in Morioka City yearly from August 1 to 4, it is one of the Tohoku's biggest summer festivals. There are more than 10,000 Wadaiko (Japanese drums) and about 35,000 people who participate. The dancers move gracefully to calls of "sakkorachoiwayasse", and parade to the beat of the drums. Anyone can participate in the "Waodori" held after the parade is finished. Don't just watch. It's more fun to try dancing.

What is Sansa?

the beginning of the Sansa Odori.

Long ago, a demon appeared in the Nambu Morioka castle town. The troubled townsfolk prayed to the god of Mitsuishi Shrine for help and the god drove out the demon. Their dancing to "sansa-sansa" around huge three stones "Mitsuishi" to give thanks to the god is said to be

Zuiganji Temple

Zuiganji Temple was founded in 828. It's said that Date Masamune had it rebuilt over five years starting in 1604 and you can feel his aesthetic sense everywhere. The magnificent sculptures in the main temple building were made during the Momoyama period (16th cent.). The main building and the temple kitchen are both must-see national treasures and important cultural properties. This is Japan Heritage site you have to see if you visit Matsushima.

Access 91, Matsushima Aza Chonai, Matsushimamachi, Miyagigun, Miyagi (About a 20-minute walk from JR Tohoku Line Matsushima Station or about a 5-minute walk from JR Senseki Line Matsushimakaigan Station.)

i-SENDAI

SENDAI Tourist Information Desk (a.k.a. i-SENDAI), located right in the heart of downtown Sendai, offers a number of activities and tours for visitors interested in Japanese cultural experiences. Come to the Sake Tasting Workshop, a bimonthly sake tasting event held at "Sake Bar Hatago," if you are a sake lover. The bar owner. Mr. Aova, will walk you through six different types of seasonal sake, where you will learn about sake on a deeper level to enjoy and appreciate sake like never before. In the "Decorative Japanese Dessert Making Workshop," you can make adorable and colorful decorative Japanese wagashi desserts with guidance from Chika Ogasawara. "SENDAI Cooking Meetup" is also among the most popular activities that i-SENDAI offers.

The Fifth Tallest Bodhisattva Statue in the World

Sendai Daikannon (Bodhisattva)

The 100m tall white statue stands at the outskirts of Sendai City. You can go up to its chest by elevator where you can enjoy the panoramic view of the city.


The Attraction of **Diverse Onsen Waters**

Naruko Onsen Kyo (Hot Spring Village)

Naruko Onsen Kyo (Hot Spring Village) has five onsen. Japan's onsen have 11 different types of water and Naruko Onsen Kyo has 9 of them. Because the color, smell and composition of each onsen's water are quite different, we highly recommend comparing the different onsen for fun. Late October is the best season



for the autumn leaves. About 10 minutes by car from Naruko Onsen Station, Naruko-kyo Gorge is a well-known sightseeing spot. A bridge over the Gorge and the vibrant warm colors of the mountain scenery are sure to remain etched in your memories.

Finely restored legendary castle of the Katakura Clan

Shiroishi Castle

Shiroishi Castle was the residence of the Katakura lords for about 260 years after the Battle of Sekigahara in 1600. In 1995 it was faithfully restored as it was then, and is appreciated as the highest quality of castle architecture restoration using wood. From the topmost third floor, you'll have a sweeping view of Shiroishi City. There's also a museum with Japanese armor and swords on display, and you can learn about samurai history there.

Access 1-16, Masuokacho, Shiroishi City, Miyagi (About 5 minutes by car from JR Shiroishi Zao Station, 10 minutes walk from JR Shiroishi Station)

Japan's Top Azalea-Viewing Spot!

Mt. Tokusenio

The 711m high Mt. Tokusenjo is said to be the best place in Japan for viewing azalea. A round trip to the summit and back is about a one and a half to two hour leisurely hike where you can appreciate 500 thousand azaleas. They are in full bloom from mid to late May. The scenery from the summit is a gorgeous contrast between the mountain dyed crimson and the blue of the Pacific Ocean


Kirakira Domburi (Colorful Glistenina Rice Bowl)

Sendai Aoba Festival

The origin of this traditional event is said to date back to a Sendai festival that started in 1655. On Saturday the eve of the festival, a feeling of excitement overflows as the Sendai Suzume Odori (Sparrow Dance) fills the streets. At night, three yamaboko (festival floats) lit up with paper lanterns parade and decorate Jozenji-dori Avenue beautifully. For the main festival the next day, there is a parade with warriors wearing Japanese armor and eleven gorgeous vamaboko. It's a perfect chance to experience Sendai's history as a castle town and Date-en, a reenactment of the castle town festival, is held In Kotodai Park on both days.

NAMAHAGE Museum

In traditional folk events handed down on the Oga Peninsula and the surrounding area. Namahage are deities who visit at the end of the year to admonish laziness, and bear tidings of good health, good harvests, and products from the mountains and oceans. The NAMAHAGE Museum with Namahage as it's theme introduces local history and climate, and it displays 150 diverse actual masks made in each village. There's also a spot where you can wear a real Namahage costume for a commemorative photo, and a shop where you can buy a wide variety of gifts. Please come and experience Akita's folk culture!

Proud to be Japan's **Deepest Cobalt Blue Lake**

Lake Tazawa

The water of the lake is a transparent cobalt blue, and you can see fish swimming in its beautiful transparency. This is Japan's deepest lake being 423.4m at its greatest depth. As the water gets deeper its surface color changes to a vivid blue, it is a sight worth seeing. The lake is a popular spot for viewing scenery from pleasure boats, and also for outdoor activities such as canoeing, kayaking and stand-up paddle boarding.

Access Semboku City, Akita (About 15 minutes by bus from JR Tazawako Station, and about 40 minutes by bus from JR Kakunodate Station)

The legend of Tatsuko

There's a famous spot at Lake Tazawa: a golden statue of a woman called Tatsukozo. The statue was built to commemorate the legend from long ago, when a young girl named Tatsuko who longed to be beautiful forever, was suddenly transformed into a dragon and thrown into the lake.

Seven Hot Springs Well Up from the Depths at Seven Inns

Nyuto Onsen (Hot Spring)

The Nyuto Onsen Village, well known throughout Japan for its secluded hot springs in Towada-Hachimantai National Park, is dotted with seven onsen inns. Each of the seven onsen has its own unique spring. There's an inn with milky water and a thatched roof, and modern Japanese inns with mountain streamside rotenburo (outdoor onsen). There's even an onsen with a quaint log waterfall. It has a wonderful diversity in water type, inn appearance and amenities. The Yumeguri Pass is a one-day pass which gives purchasers' access to all seven onsen and also includes use of a convenient shuttle bus. Kiritampo (Rice Cylinders)

Kiritampo Nabe is Akita's most recognizable dish. 'Tampo' refers to cooked rice wrapped on a skewer which is then baked. Long and narrow in shape, this spear-like cylinder can be cut in half or into thirds which is how it earned the name 'Kiri (cut) tampo.' Chicken, burdock, mushrooms, and other ingredients are cooked together in a soy sauce broth, creating a simple but delicious hot pot dish which is well-loved in Akita. Be sure to try Akita's taste of home.





Inaniwa Udon

Inaniwa Udon is dried udon noodles made by skilled artisans. They are thick bodied, and have a smooth feel on the tongue. In the strainer, the noodles have a shiny luster and an elasticity that slides smoothly down your throat. Making them takes three to four days and a lot of effort. These noodles are valuable as they are not mass produced so they are popular as a special gift.

Unique Texture Captivates Chicken Lovers



Hinai Chickens

Reputed as one of the top three chickens, the Hinai Free-range Chickens have a unique firm texture and a full bodied umami flavor. Its high rating lends to the fact that nothing is wasted from this chicken as a rich stock is made from the bones and meat, and the birds' flavor-rich eggs are also a real treat. Yakitori (grilled chicken). Ovakodon (chicken and egg rice bowl) and hot pots made with Hinai Chicken have an unforgettable taste.

The particular raising method.

Different from a broiler chicken, they are raised as free-range chickens. Each chicken having about 3.3 to 5 square meters is the standard. Only females are selected and are carefully raised for a long period of about six months.

Over 10,000 Paper Lanterns Shine in the Incredibl Night Sky

Akita Kanto Festival

Akita Kanto Festival – an event where locals pray for bountiful harvests while giant lantern structures, called kanto, sway in the summer night sky. This festival is one of the great summer festivals in Tohoku, and is a National Important Intangible Folk Cultural Property with a history spanning about 270 years. The skill of raising and manipulating the large kanto requires a good sense of balance. This traditional technique has been passed down for generations.

Omagari Hanabi National Fireworks Competition

With a proud history of over 100 years, this is one of Japan's top fireworks displays. Its power, history and tradition draws over 700 thousand spectators yearly. Thematically original and very creative fireworks are freely combined as 18 thousand bursts of artistic light fill the night sky. The show also takes place in spring, fall and winter.

Kakunodate Sakura (Cherry Trees) Festival

Kakunodate still has vestiges of an early Edo period castle town. Even now Shidarezakura (weeping cherry) bloom on the street where samurai residences still remain, and a road lined of the Hinokinai River side with the beautiful pink Someyoshino Sakura awaits you. It's even more fantastic lit up at night.

Yamadera Risshaku-ii Temple

The Hoshusan Risshaku-ji Temple, commonly called Yamadera, was built in 860 AD. It has vast temple grounds of 1.9M square meters, and in it more than 30 large and small temple buildings remain. Especially famous are the 1015 stone steps to the summit. Along the one hour walk from the trailhead to the Great Buddha Hall inner sanctuary can be found the Godaido hall, the best scenic spot of Yamadera, offering a splendid view of the surrounding rural landscape. Yamadera is a popular praying destination that has many attractions.

Dewa Sanzan (Three Mountains of Dewa)



Dewa Sanzan consists of three mountains: Mt. Haguro, Mt. Gassan, and Mt. Yudono. They've been loved since ancient times as sacred mountains. The trip is said to be a rebirth journey with Mt. Haguro representing your present life, Mt. Gassan your past life and Mt. Yudono your future life.

Access Tsuruoka City, Yamagata (Mt. Haguro: About 55 minutes by bus from JR Tsuruoka Station, Mt. Gassan: About 2 hours and 5 minutes by bus from JR Tsuruoka Station [The bus only runs during summer]. Mt. Yudono: About 50 minutes by car from JR Tsuruoka Station)

Feel the Culture of The Uesugi Warrior Clan

Uesugi Shrine

Uesugi-jinja Shrine was built on the site of Yonezawa Castle to enshrine Uesugi Kenshin, the bravest warrior in the Sengoku period, who is also known as "God of War". The most part of the shrine was destroyed by the Great Fire of Yonezawa during the Taisho period, but it rebuilt a few years later. The shrine was designed by Ito Chuta, the pioneer of shrine architecture from Yonezawa City. There is Keishoden, the treasure house with a large collection of Important Cultural Properties related to the Uesugi clan, in the precincts, and Yonezawa City Uesugi Museum is also located near the house

The hot spring can be enjoyed casually at one of the three public baths as the entrance to each (Kamiyu, Shimoyu and Kawarayu) is just 200 yen. They are close to each other so we recommend trying them all.

The rounded water tank holding 40 tons of water with about 2.000 Aurelia jellyfish swimming in it is a must-see attraction. Jellyfish goods and jellyfish ice cream sold only here are pretty popular.

Yonezawa Beef



It's said that four-legged animals were not eaten in Yonezawa at the start of the Meiji period, but after British teacher Charles Henry Dallas ate some of the Wagyu beef, its use as a food source began. Surprised by how tasty it was, Mr. Dallas took a cow back to Yokohama with him and from there its consumption spread throughout Japan.



Three Famous Fruits of Yamagata

One of Japan's most famous wagyu (Japanese beef)

is Yonezawa Beef. Used in Yamagata's premium

dining, this fully marbled meat not only has a delicious

taste but also melts in your mouth, and there are

many famous restaurants in Yonezawa City which

serve this beef. Its deliciousness can be savored in

many ways including grilled as steak, cooked in

shabu-shabu hotpot and in various other meat dishes.

Cherries. La France Pears and Grapes

Yamagata Prefecture grows about 70% of Japan's cherries. The harvest season is from April to July and in there are many orchards in the prefecture to try cherry picking and eat them off the trees. Yamagata also has about 80% share of La France pear production. The harvest season is from October to January and their sophisticated sweetness and juicy tenderness makes them popular as a gift. Grapes cultivation in Yamagata dates back about 400 years with fairly abundant varieties such as Kyoho, Takao and Pione. Fresh and tasty fruits can be had throughout the year in Yamagata.



Beautiful Art Created by Nature

Snow Monsters and Illumination

The world-famous snow monsters, known as juhvo. are soft rime covered trees, a beautiful work of art only on display in winter. If you take the ropeway from the Zao Onsen resort in the afternoon you can observe the snow monster forest below, and if you ski or snowboard, you can enjoy sliding nearby and see them up close. The snow monsters are also illuminated on some nights to create an absolutely fantastic scenery.

Komine Castle

Komine Castle is a renowned castle that was largely rebuilt by Niwa Nagashige in 1632, during the early Edo period. The beautiful stone-walled and graceful Sanjyuyagura castle was largely burned down during the Boshin War (1868 to 1869). But, it was faithfully restored using wood in the Heisei era (1989 to 2019) based on excavation, research and Edo period drawings. It's also been selected as one of Japan's Top 100 Castles.

Access Vakunai, Shirakawa City, Fukushima (About a 5 minute walk from JR Shirakawa Station)

A Blustery Plateau Brimming with Greenery

Koriyama Nunobiki Kaze no Kogen (Kaze no Highland)

Referred to as the Windy Plateau, this highland is home to 33 power-generating wind turbines, each 100m tall, lined up like giants, tuning slowly as they intake the gales provided by mother nature. It's a popular spot with a sweeping view of Mt. Bandai and Lake Inawashiro. There's an observation platform and a walking course, and rapeseed flowers in the spring, sunflowers in the summer and cosmos in the fall are in full bloom.
